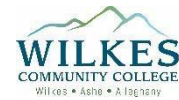

What is Leadership Ashe?

TO INFORM...TO MOTIVATE...TO CHALLENGE! Leadership Ashe is an innovative leadership development program in partnership with several local organizations. This program is coordinated by Wilkes Community College's Workforce Development & Community Education program and the Ashe County Chamber of Commerce. The Ashe County Chamber of Commerce, specifically the Business & Community Development Committee, plays a pivotal role in the facilitation of the program. Many other local organizations and businesses are also involved in the program as host locations, tour sites, and session speakers.

This program is designed to meet our county's need for active participation by informed, educated citizens and local leaders. The program aims to identify potential leaders and provide them with the information and encouragement needed to spur local involvement. Graduates are challenged to apply their talents by becoming a part of community organizations, including public boards, non-profit groups, civic clubs, and the Chamber.

How is the Program Structured?

Leadership Ashe is comprised of 11 sessions that will provide leadership activities and tours of area businesses, organizations, and facilities. The program will begin in August with a retreat followed by the first program session and will conclude with an evening graduation ceremony in December. All sessions are planned by leaders in the topic areas who offer insightful information and thoughtful analysis. Sessions are designed to stimulate interest, awareness, and interaction and facilitate discussion. Participants are asked to make a major time commitment to attend these 11 sessions.

How are Participants Selected?

The class is open to 20 participants. *(Please note class size may change based on COVID-19 restrictions).* Prospective participants are encouraged to apply and should complete the enclosed application, which will be reviewed by a selection committee. After a thorough review of all submitted applications, participants will be selected to create a good cross-section of the community, representing geographical, occupational, racial, and general diversity.

What is the Program Cost?

The class tuition fee of \$275 includes program materials, graduation reception, and a diploma award. Additionally, graduates will receive continuing education credits for this program. A limited number of partial scholarships are available, based on need. Program sponsors supplement other costs.

Expectations of Participants

Leadership Ashe is made possible by a collaborative effort of a committee that works hard to plan, organize, and provide the best possible experience for participants to see all that makes Ashe County the "Coolest Corner of North Carolina!" As a participant in Leadership Ashe, you are not only furthering your leadership knowledge, but you are also a representative of Wilkes Community College, the Chamber of Commerce, and your employer or organization. The utmost professional conduct should always be upheld when visiting various locations, communicating with representatives, listening to presenters, and the like.

Tremendous efforts are made to organize Leadership Ashe participant visits to various locations, and attendance at all scheduled sessions is expected. **To receive continuing education credits and to participate in the graduation ceremony, all participants must attend the retreat session and must have at least 80% attendance of all other sessions. If you cannot attend the retreat session, or commit to at least 80% attendance, you will need to wait until the next year's program to apply so others can participate.**

Participants will be expected to read a book prior to the retreat session. **We ask that all participants read this book by the retreat date as a discussion of this book will take place during the retreat.** Participants will be notified with their acceptance letters regarding the book selection.

Communication for Leadership Ashe is conducted via email. Participants are expected to check their email regularly during the program for general updates about sessions including upcoming session reminders, site visit rules, or important scheduling changes. Emails will be sent from Becky Greer, rcgreer213@wilkescc.edu. Participants are also encouraged to complete evaluations after each session.

COVID-19 Statement:

Leadership Ashe will address current COVID-19 restrictions and communicate these with selected participants prior to the start of the program. We will follow all recommended guidelines that may be in place during this class as recommended or required by a combination of the N.C. Dept. of Health & Human Services, App Health Care, Wilkes Community College, and the Ashe Chamber. Participants may be required to supply and correctly wear masks if required by a host facility.

DATE	FOCUS AREA	DESCRIPTION
Week 1 August 12 <i>*required attendance</i>	Kickoff & Environmental Leadership 8:30am – 5pm	Full-Day Session (<i>casual dress</i>). Orientation, classmate networking, team-building exercises, leadership tenets, and book discussion. Breakfast items, lunch & snacks provided. After lunch, a session on environmental topics will be the focus with special guests.
Week 2 August 18	Government Leadership 12:15 pm – 5:00 pm	Government officials and staff will discuss the departments, functions, and operations of county and municipal government.
Week 3 September 1	Tourism Leadership 12:15 pm – 5:00 pm	Learn about tourism efforts in the county from the Chamber, the Towns & other organizations. Presentations on marketing efforts & attractions. Hear from leaders on the benefits of tourism & its effect on our economy.
Week 4 September 15	Healthcare & Human Services Leadership 12:15 pm – 5:00 pm	Presentations and tours by local healthcare and human services organizations will focus on the variety of these services available in Ashe County.
Week 5 September 29	Agricultural Leadership 12:15 pm – 5:00 pm	Agriculture in Ashe County continues to be the foremost economic driver and a vital part of our economy. Participants will learn more about the county's diverse agriculture offerings during this session with presentations & tours.
Week 6 October 13	Technology Leadership 12:15 pm – 5:00 pm	This session focuses on the technology that exists in our community. From fiber to state-of-the-art energy solutions and video/music/media production services, participants will tour several areas of interest & hear from multiple facets of technology present at local organizations.
Week 7 October 27	Industrial Leadership 12:15 pm – 5:00 pm	Participants will visit various industrial companies for a facility tour and will hear from representatives from each industry on services provided, created, or manufactured, as well as advantages & challenges facing industry in this region.
Week 8 November 3	Education/Workforce Development Leadership 12:15 pm – 5:00 pm	Education leaders will discuss the challenges and opportunities of education in Ashe County with a focus on primary & secondary education. Session will include a school tour. Long-range plans will be covered as well as updates on the WCC Early College & recent WCC expansion.
Week 9 November 17	Food & Hospitality Leadership 12:15 pm – 5:00 pm	Presentations and tours by local restaurant & brewery owners as well as a focus on hospitality & local food offerings within Ashe County which is a fast-growing local market.
Week 10 December 1	Cultural Leadership 12:15 pm – 5:00 pm	Our cultural heritage, arts, & history has been a significant part of the revitalization of our communities. Local leaders examine the impact of our vast variety of historical & cultural arts offerings in the county. Also, participants will visit the Ashe Library & tour a culture-related venue.
Week 11 December 8 <i>*required attendance</i>	Entrepreneurial Leadership 12:15 pm – 5:00 pm Wrap-up & Graduation Festivities 5:00pm – until	Participants will learn about the growing entrepreneurial scene in the Ashe County with special presentations by local entrepreneurs & other programs designed to benefit entrepreneurs. Course debrief & wrap up. Discussion of YOUR vision of Ashe County. Conclude with a graduation celebration complete with special guests, certificates & reception.
